Pipe-Find

Materials Needed: pipe and 10 blindfolds

Focus Area

Communication

Trust

Time Needed: 20-30 minutes or until the goal is completed

Group Size: 10-40 people

Directions

I need 10 volunteers to be blindfolded

- I will five you a number 1-10 and place you in part of the room
- All those not blindfolded will stand sporadically around the room.
- Your goal is to get all blindfolded people to line up on the pole #1-10.
- Rules:
 - NO ONE CAN SPEAK: no verbal communication of any kind!
 - The non-blindfolded people cannot move, they can only move to make sure that the blindfolded people do not hit the wall or bump into furniture.
 - They can only redirect a blindfolded person should they bump into each other, they should use their hands, touching their shoulders only.
- Other Rules: (not verbalized): The facilitators go around the room, randomly re-directing people with a different kind of touch, on the back.

Debriefing Questions

- 1. What did you learn about communication?
 - a. What kinds did you use?
- 2. Was there someone who took the lead?
 - a. How?
- 3. Was it hard to be blindfolded? Non-Blindfolded? Why?
- 4. Part of this exercise is about making sense of chaos: What do you think that means? How does it apply?
- 5. How can see this apply to leadership? Communication?
- 6. What would have made this easier, besides the obvious?
